BUSINESS

• Chairman's Report: 38 people attended the July 4th hike and Stone Pool Garden dedication.

The resident at 106 North Jackson was uncooperative during a brief meeting with Rich. Dave will take a look at the property boundaries, especially in relation to the Breakback Run Trail. Tommy noted that the resident may have been a target of property maintenance ordinance enforcement.

The Friends of Maple Ridge met last evening. The public fundraising goal will be \$500,000 based on some assumptions about the property sale price. Currently the County is conducting an updated appraisal of the property, the results of which will be available within a few weeks.

At Synnott's Pond, Mr. Pritchard has hauled stones from his property to the pond area for use as a stream lining. Placing these stones will be a Boy Scout project.

 Capital Projects (Dave Kreck): The State requires inspection of all storm water inlets; this should be a Scout project. To meet a related public education requirement, a mayoral letter will be inserted with sewer bills.

The Lenape Pump Station will be replaced this fall. Dave will make sure that there is enough clearance on public land to move in a backhoe to Comey's Lake.

The 3 Shawnee Drive gabion baskets that we placed in March should be checked to see how well they are containing erosion.
